TOPICS: We will accept submissions on a wide variety of topics at the intersection of law and technology, including but not limited to: intellectual property, antitrust, First Amendment, entertainment and new media, telecommunications, biotechnology, internet, and cybercrime.

DEADLINE: Submissions must be received by Feb. 28, 2009.

RULES:

1. The competition is open to all J.D. candidates.
2. Each student may submit only one entry.
3. Submitted papers must be unpublished. Papers must be no more than 50 pages long, including footnotes. Do NOT use endnotes. Margins should be 1", minimum. Body text must be double spaced. Font must be Times New Roman or a similar serif font, and 12 point. Footnotes may be 10 pt and single spaced but there should be a space between notes. Citations must conform to the 18th Ed. of *The Bluebook*. Submissions are judged anonymously, so the author's name should not appear anywhere on the paper.
4. To submit electronically, please send the completed cover sheet and a copy of your paper to btlj@law.berkeley.edu with the subject header "Notes & Comments." Submissions MUST include a signed cover sheet that may be downloaded from the Journal website.
